

## **EXECUTIVE ORDER N<sup>o</sup>. 9**

### **EXTENDING THE SUSPENSION OF PROTECTIVE TARIFF ON CEMENT**

1. **WHEREAS**, to encourage the establishment of local industries for the supply of goods and services to the public at reasonable prices, the Government of the Republic of Liberia granted incentives to local industries, including CEMENCO, on raw materials for the production of cement product;
2. **WHEREAS**, the need to protect infant industries, promote growth and subsequently enhance local markets, the Government of the Republic of Liberia imposed a protective tariff of Two United States Dollars (US\$2.00) for 50kg bag on Portland cement, tariff number 25.23;
3. **WHEREAS AND WHEREFORE**, the desirous and expected results have not been significantly materialized, and the cost of cement continues to rise on the market to the disadvantage of the consumer and the public as a whole;
4. **NOW THEREFORE**, the Government of Liberia in the interest of competition with cost reduction effect has determined that the suspension of the Two United States Dollars (US\$2.00) protective tariff imposed on per a 50kg bag Portland cement for construction, under the Revenue Code of Liberia Act of 2000, Tariff Schedule No. 25.23 is hereby extended for Twelve (12) Calendar months.
5. This Executive Order shall take effect on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of June A.D., 2007.
